# Year 3 WOW Starter

To kick off our thought provoking new topic, "Why are the Himalayas sacred to Hindus?" Year 3 children recently delved into a day full of engaging activities centred around this theme. The children enjoyed a range of experiences, including making delicious mango lassi and coconut squares, creating stunning rangoli patterns using coloured rice and participating in traditional Hindu dances.



## YEAR 5 'POP-UP MUSEUM'



To promote curiosity and wonder within our World War One topic, Year 5 pupils explored artefacts from the time period loaned to school from a local museum. The pupils were able to spend time discussing the artefacts before coming together to generate some extremely thoughtful and pertinent questions. During the afternoon, the artefacts provided inspiration for some observational sketching. What a fabulous start to this fascinating topic!

The children have had a wonderful first week in the Nursery, exploring their new areas and making new friends, as well as practising skills including transporting, rolling, moving and balancing. ## The journey of food around the world

Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their WOW opener to their new topic 'The journey of our food around the world!' Visiting Sandfield Farm opened up a discussion around what harvest meant to a local farmer and the impact of global harvesting on the climate crisis, whilst also promoting a learning opportunity to explore whether or not that our locally grown produce is healthier for our bodies. Exploring the landscape, they harvested their own plums, pears, apples and blackberries, testing their ripeness with a yummy taste!



## Down to the River



Year 1 very much enjoyed their visit to the River Avon as an introduction to their new topic, with a focus on sustainable development and the amazing work of Boyan Slat. The children discussed what a boat might see as it sails down the river and will learn more about this throughout the coming weeks.
