Key changes

Brand new set of tests 2 x reading, 2 x SPAG and 2 x mathematics.

No longer a test for English writing.

Introduction of an arithmetic test in mathematics.

Scaled scores with a score of 100 and above representing

'expected standard'

Reading

There is a greater emphasis on the comprehension elements of the new curriculum.

2 papers involving a range of genres.

Paper 1- Combined reading prompt and answer booklet.

Paper 2- Separate reading booklet and reading answer booklet.

Reading

The children will be asked to make inferences from the text- using clues to answer questions. (See example)

Questions will be answered in different ways including:

Writing an answer on the line provided.

Copying words from the text.

Ticking the correct box/boxes.

SPAG - Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

The tests have an emphasis on the technical aspects of grammar.

Paper 1 focuses on spelling.

Paper 2 focuses on pupils' knowledge of grammar, punctuation and vocabulary.

Spelling Test

This test will consist of 20 spellings.

The teacher reads the word, then reads it in the context of a sentence and then reads it again.

All the spellings will be based on the spelling patterns the children have learnt in Year 1 and Year 2, which are in the National Curriculum framework.

Examples of spelling patterns

Days of the week and months of the year.

adding er and est to adjectives - faster

the sound s sound spelt c before e,i and y - face

words starting with kn or g - knew

words ending in el,al,il - pencil, model, petal

words with a suffix ending in ment,ness,ful,less,ly - peaceful

adding es to nouns and verbs ending in y - teddies

Mathematics Paper 1 - Arithmetic test

Paper 1 assesses pupils' confidence and fluency with whole numbers, place-value and counting.

The questions involve all four operations $(+ - x \div)$ and finding fractions of numbers.

Pupils are not allowed any resources to help them.

Mathematics Paper 2 - Reasoning test

Paper 2 focuses on reasoning assesses pupils' fluency, problem solving and reasoning skills.

This test involves all areas of mathematics including number, calculations, fractions, measurements, shape and statistics.

Pupils are not allowed any resources to help them.
